

Long-Term Follow-up After an Initial Episode of Diverticulitis: What Are the Predictors of Recurrence?


A recent study conducted by researchers at Lahey Clinic concludes that although diverticulitis recurrence is common following an initial attack that has been managed medically, complicated recurrence is uncommon. Relying on data captured from the records of 954 patients treated at Lahey between 2002 and 2008, the study was published in the March 2011 issue of *Diseases of the Colon and Rectum*, the official journal of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons. The study also found that patients who present with a family history of diverticulitis, long segment of involved colon, and/or retroperitoneal abscess

are at higher risk for recurrent disease. Patients who present with right-sided diverticulitis are at low risk for recurrent disease.

These research findings from Lahey will be a useful guide for colon and rectal surgery departments across the globe when counseling patients regarding the potential benefits of prophylactic colectomy (the surgical operation in which part or all of the colon is removed).
